Year in Review

PROJECTS AND PROGRAMS



Stratton Town Forest Project was originally slated to open to the public in the summer of 2023. We were able to open to the public in the fall of 2022, two full seasons ahead of schedule.

2022:

\$15,000 Spent Resulting in:

2 miles of Adaptive/Family Friendly Trail on three trails.

2 new backcountry zones

1 new driveway and parking lot

Improving the overall health of the forest.

Removing 30 bag of trash from the property and improving habitat.

45 pound of wildflower/pollinator mix planted.

More Roots than anyone should have to cut.

4 Benches Built for the bench naming campaign.

2023: 7k from VMBA and 10k from Great River Hydro

Completion of the Access Trail to Sweet Tooth.

The New Sweet Wood Loop above Sweet Tooth bring us to the Bottom of the Hollywood Bowl.

Building 3 new Bridges

Addition of a BBQ Gathering area below the parking lot.

A new permanent kiosk with community information.

Surfacing of the parking lot with cerpak to make the lot more usable in mud season.









Last year with the help of VMBA,s Executive Director and a VMBA grant we were able to invest roughly 200 hours in doing a deep dive on what was permissible under the Mount Snow original Act250 permit from the 1990's. What was found is that the trails had always been permitted for full bunch cut construction to make the historical trails better suited for mountain biking. With that knowledge we have partnered with Vail/Mount Snow to improve access to our communities oldest and most used trail pod



Trails at Crosstown

2023:

VMBA trail grant awarded for \$7,000 to: Improve user access on the Sherwood Forest/Friar Tuck Loop by bring the trail up to an aMTB green square standard.

Work begins this Monday June 12th and will take roughly 30 days to complete.

Mount Snow is printing all of the intersection signage and we are providing signage posts. The same as the ones at the Stratton Town Forest.

Invited to re-apply for the fall 2023 NFC trail improvement grant for \$10,000 which will be used for the 2024 season to finish the King Author/robing hood section.

We are currently working with our wetland specialist at ANR to come up with and execution plan for the replacement of the wetland gap bridge. Which we hope to build in 2025.



The Stratton Recreation area is an amazing resource where the town of Town of Stratton has built and amazing infrastructure to support recreational activities. There is currently several picnic areas, a ice skating rink, tubing hill, play ground, ball fields, cross country ski trails and adaptive friendly facilities. Our goal is to further improve the access to the property for all users and increase user traffic the high unutilized resource. There is an existing Act250 permit on property which we are in the process of amending.

Stratton Recreation Area

2023:

\$15,000 RFP Grant submitted to build a 2 mile, green circle aMTB/Family friendly multi use loop to the top of the property which will take 2 months to build. Unfortunately it looks like the awards have been pushed back till the end of august so we will hopefully be able to begin work 2024 fully funded

So far we have invested 325 hours in the applications and preparation of all the supporting materials necessary for the Act250 permit and its accompanying Storm water permit.

Successful site visit with the Wetlands Dept. of ANR to review the flagged proposed trail and are currently awaiting their report to add as an exhibit to the act250 permit/amendment and Storm water permit.



Wardsboro Village Trail


We are currently working with The Wardsboro School, several community members and a State youth enrichment program to develop a plan for loop connecting the School to the Skate park.

This trail can then be used as part of the expanded youth programing we are working on with the school district.

There are several landowners that we need to obtain permission from the project to move forward

We project that the trail will take roughly two month to build and the total project cost to be \$20,000.

We are currently also working with the Vermont Better Places Program on 2:1 non competitive match grant. We raise \$5000 the will match with \$10,000. This Grant very specific to only being used for village centers.



In the winter of 2022 we began winter adventure program for those youth from the Dover School that did not participate in the school ski program exposing them to basic outdoor basic skills with goal of sparking their interest in the outdoors and inspiring the next generation out door stewards. This program was funded from a grant from the Lintilhac Foundation.

Winter Youth Adventure Program

Our first year we had a total of 10 participants.

We hired our first staff member

This past year that grew to 22 total children.

We are now working to expand that program to both Wardsboro and Dover. Which would bring the program size to roughly 40 participants for the 2024 season,

We are also working towards assisting the Dover School with their summer program and expanding it a two full months.









Continue to work with our local partners it increase the economic viability of our communities through sustainable four season recreation.






